## MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT



A few weeks ago, Pastor Joe's sermon spoke about Salt. That got me to thinking and I thought I'd focus this message on salt.

Did you know there are 44 references to salt in the Bible (Old Testament=37, new=7). Salt is a two-edged sword. In small amounts it adds taste to bland foods, but too much can ruin the taste. Centuries ago salt was used to preserve meats, but it had to be thoroughly rinsed out before consuming it.

Salt is essential for life.

Cows lick salt to keep their bodies functioning properly. It supports their water regulation, blood flow, growth, fertility, as well as aiding with milk production. They can die in extreme cases of deprivation.

Humans need salt, but not too much. It's necessary for good health. It plays a vital role in nerve and muscle function and helps our bodies maintain fluid balances.

Christians are called to be salt of the earth. Just remember too much can be off-putting and counter-productive, and too little (or none) has no effect. We've got to strike the right balance.

We are to 'season' the world around us. As Christians we can do this by our words and actions. Be pleasant. Be a good example. Be a 'seasoning' for someone. But not too much....

#### **EDUCATION:**

Marianne Daily reported that the Girls Lunch discussed doing backpacks for Mothers for Mothers Day. Packs will be located in the Narthex where people can pick one up and it will have a note card with suggested items. Once filled they would be brought back to church for delivery to Canal Winchester Human Services. We would offer everyone in the church the opportunity to participate.

Also discussed Easter for kids. No egg hunt but in the place of that we would make Easter baskets. Marianne will do the baskets, council members were asked to provide individually wrapped candy and some small toy(s). Won't need a lot, will make 10-15 baskets.

Fifth Sundays – discussed ways in which we might plan special events on fifth Sundays. Suggested was that the offering on those Sundays be donated to a special cause. Or have some social event (game night, dinner, lunch etc.) Suggestions would be appreciated.
