Today's Procession hymn, "All Glory, Laud, and Honor" was written by Theodulph of Orleans about 820 a.d. He was a brilliant man who worked hard to reform the clergy. He established schools and advanced education. He advocated high morals, built churches, and composed hymns of praise to God. As he meditated on our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem prior to His Crucifixion and Resurrection, he wrote this great Palm Sunday hymn. Originally there were 78 verses. The first several are the ones we commonly sing today.

PALM SUNDAY: JESUS' TRIUMP ENTRY TO JERUSALEM

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where crowds welcomed Him by waving palm branches and shouting "Hosanna!" This event reminds Christians to open their hearts to Jesus and commit to following Him.



Palm Sunday services often include the blessing of palms and a reading of the Passion, which re-

counts Jesus' suffering and crucifixion, setting the stage for Holy Week and the journey to Easter. Jesus entered the city knowing He would be tried and crucified and welcomed His fate to rise from the grave and save us from sin! Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the remembrance of Jesus' last days. The altar flower chart is in the Narthex where you may sign up to place flowers on the altar. Flowers are \$35. You may leave the money in the envelope under the chart for Linda Leist. Please be sure to indicate if the flowers are for a special occasion.

HOW DOES THE EASTER BUNNY Relate to easter?

The Easter Bunny, while not explicitly mentioned in the Bible, has become a popular symbol of Easter, particularly for children. Its origins are rooted in pagan traditions of fertility and new life, with rabbits being associated with spring and rebirth. Over time, these traditions were intertwined with the Christian celebration of the resurrection of

Jesus, making the Easter Bunny a part of the broader Easter experience.
